### **Colorado Lottery Denver Office is Moving**

Pueblo, Colo. – For the first time in more than 30 years, the Colorado Lottery Denver office is moving out of its longtime Denver Galleria offices. The Lottery will be moving into the Colorado Department of Revenue offices at 1881 Pierce Street effective July 1, 2021.

The Colorado Lottery has been located at 720 S. Colorado Blvd. in the Galleria building nearly since its inception in 1983. As part of the state's goal to decrease its real estate footprint and save on expenses, the Lottery's Denver corporate and claims office will be moving to Lakewood.

The Lottery will join two other divisions within the Department of Revenue - the Department of Motor Vehicles (DMV) and the Taxation division. Suite #136 is reserved for Lottery executive offices, and the new claims office will be across the hall in Suite #132. People needing claims services should enter through Entrance A on the west side of the building – the same entrance that is used for the DMV.

This move will not only reduce the Lottery's square footage by nearly 60%, but its annual rent will decrease by about 70%.

"We are excited to join our friends at the Pierce street location which will save the Lottery money on rent which is cost savings that ultimately gets passed through to our proceeds beneficiaries to support outdoor recreation, conservation and schools in Colorado," said Tom Seaver, Director of the Lottery. "The Lottery has been 70% work-from-home since the shutdown over a year ago, and we are all looking forward to some return to normalcy and seeing each other in the new office!"

The Lottery is transitioning most of its staff to a hybrid work from home model and will make online claims available in the next year which will save players valuable time. The Colorado Lottery's Denver office hours will remain the same. For now, winners must continue to make an appointment to claim prizes.
